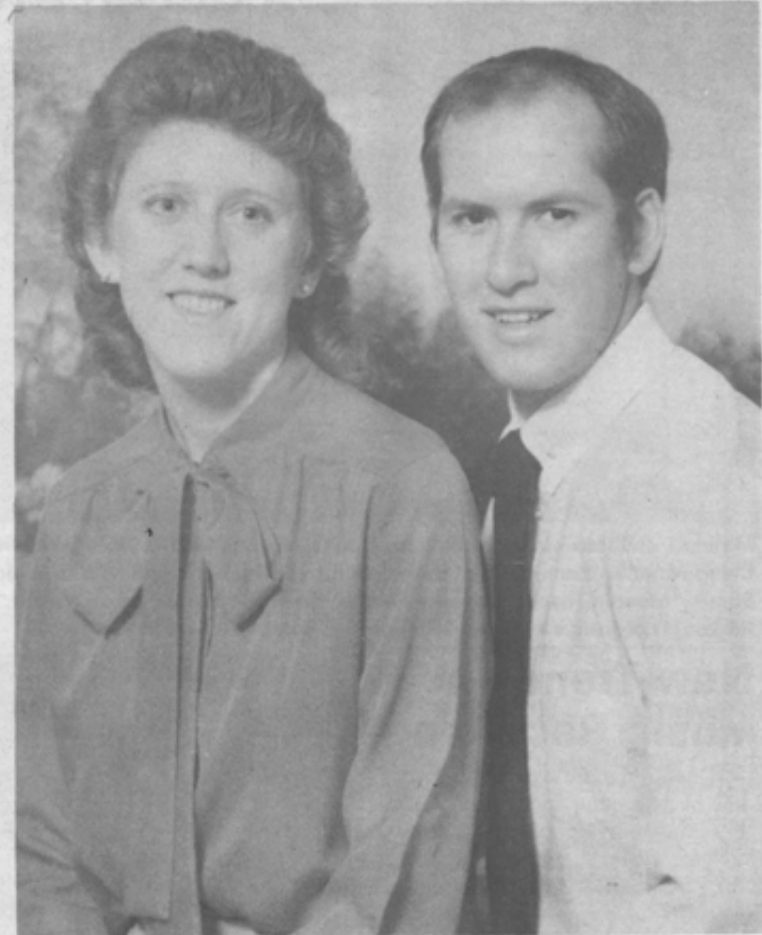

## Living Will Legislation

The Ohio House of Representatives recently voted to approve one of the most controversial bills to come before the 116th General Assembly—a "living will" proposal.

A "living will" permits terminally ill people to sign a document stating they don't want heroic medical measures to keep them alive. Sub. House Bill 220 calls for living wills to be honored if non-communicative terminally ill patients have made such wills or if guardians or relatives agree on behalf of a permanently unconscious patient. Most importantly, the bill provides legal protection to physicians who carry out living will directives.

### Reporting Child Abuse

In conjunction with heightened public awareness of child abuse, state lawmakers have passed legislation designed to include one more group to those required to

report potential abuse.

The proposal, House Bill 528 would require school employees to report child abuse and neglect. Under current statute, only school teachers and school authorities are required to do so. Proponents stress, however, that anyone who sees students on a daily basis should be responsible for reporting alleged abuse.

House Bill 528 recently passed the Ohio House and awaits Senate Consideration.

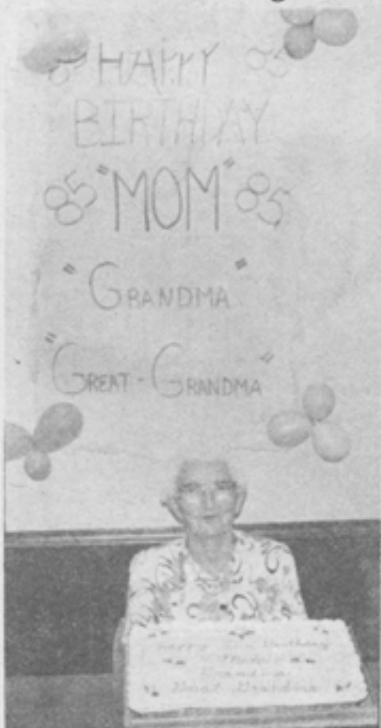

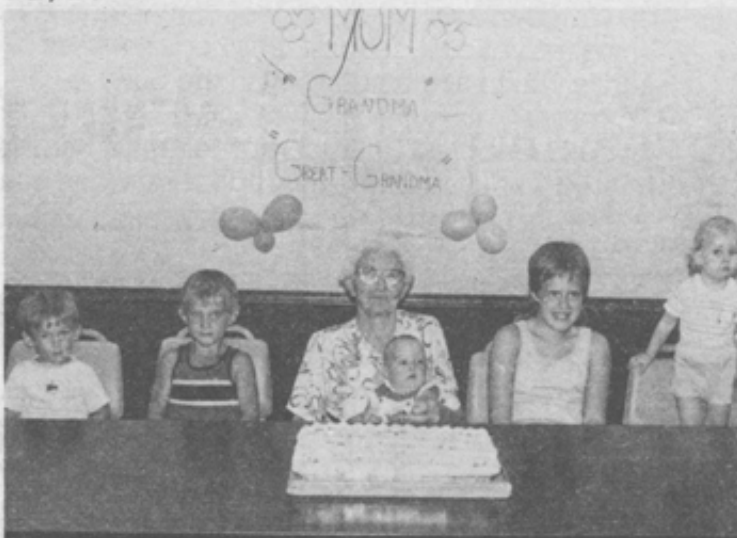

## Farm Focus Wagon Tours

This year's Farm Focus Wagon Tour is approximately four miles long and will take the visitor past almost 500 crop treatments. Charles Profit is the committee chairman in charge of narrating the wagon tours. He says, "We are very pleased to have you view our Farm Focus crop research program. You will get an excellent chance to see and compare many different weed herbicide plots."

All herbicide plots were applied by Extension Service personnel using accurate research methods. All other plots were either planted or supervised by the Van Wert County Extension Service. By all means, feel free to take a walking tour through the Farm Focus Show Plots.

There are 31 points of interest on the wagon tour this year. In addition to corn and soybean varieties and herbicides, you can view soil insecticide plots, no-till corn, ditch bank vegetation controls, soybean root rot chemicals, corn nitrogen trials, and soybean fertility experiments. In addition, don't miss the certified and un-certified soybean seed test. A highlight of this year's tour will be a tiling and drainage tubing demonstration. Some 20 acres will be drained using various types of ditching equipment.

Ed Keber, in charge of wagon tour drivers, and his staff will surely make your visit to Farm Focus enjoyable. This year there will be 26 wagons running the wagon tours on a five minute interval. It will take approximately 45 minutes to take one of the free wagon tours.

Be sure to sign up for the test plot results booklet at the Wagon Tour Tent. It will contain the results of all Farm Focus test plots as well as results of the Van Wert County replicated corn and soybean testing program.
