When school begins next fall, Marion Local High School students will miss seeing a familiar face, one that has been present at the school for the past 25 years.

Sister Rita Yahl who has been an educator in a career spanning 22 years will retire from the position of home economics teacher at the school.

A native of Auglaize County, Sister Rita has taught in a variety of other assignments. She began her career as an elementary teacher in Phoenix, Arizona. Prior to coming to Marion Local she taught grades one through seven in several other parts of the country including: Linton, North Dakota, Bellefontaine, Ohio, and North College Hill near Cincinnati.

Sister Rita, who received her bachelor's degree from the University of Dayton and her Master of Education degree from St.

Louis University, noted there have been many changes within the span of her career. During the first few years of her career each year was similar to the last. However during the 70's many changes in education started taking place, especially numerous additions to the curriculum & increased regulations. Then during the 80's schools started preparing students for the technological age and computers were included into the educational program. Sister Rita noted there has been a change in the public's view of education. She feels that in general people recognize the importance of education and view it as a necessity for employment. Most young people are beginning to realize that their education is never complete, but will continue throughout their lifetime.

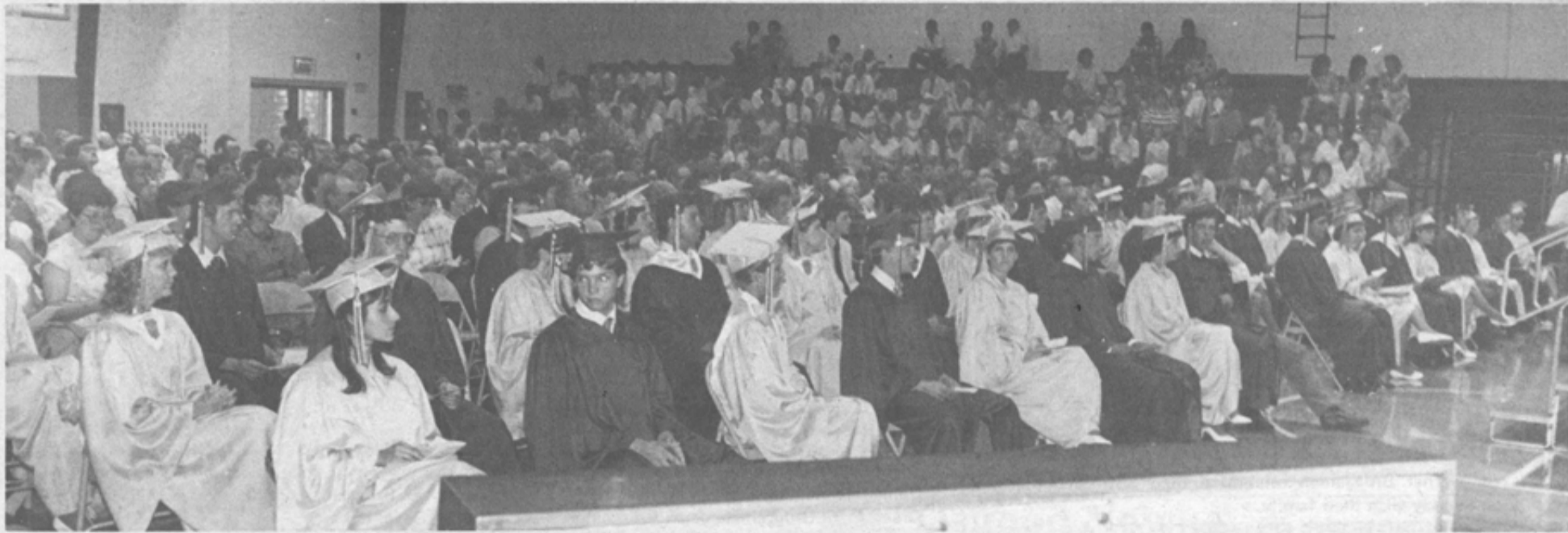

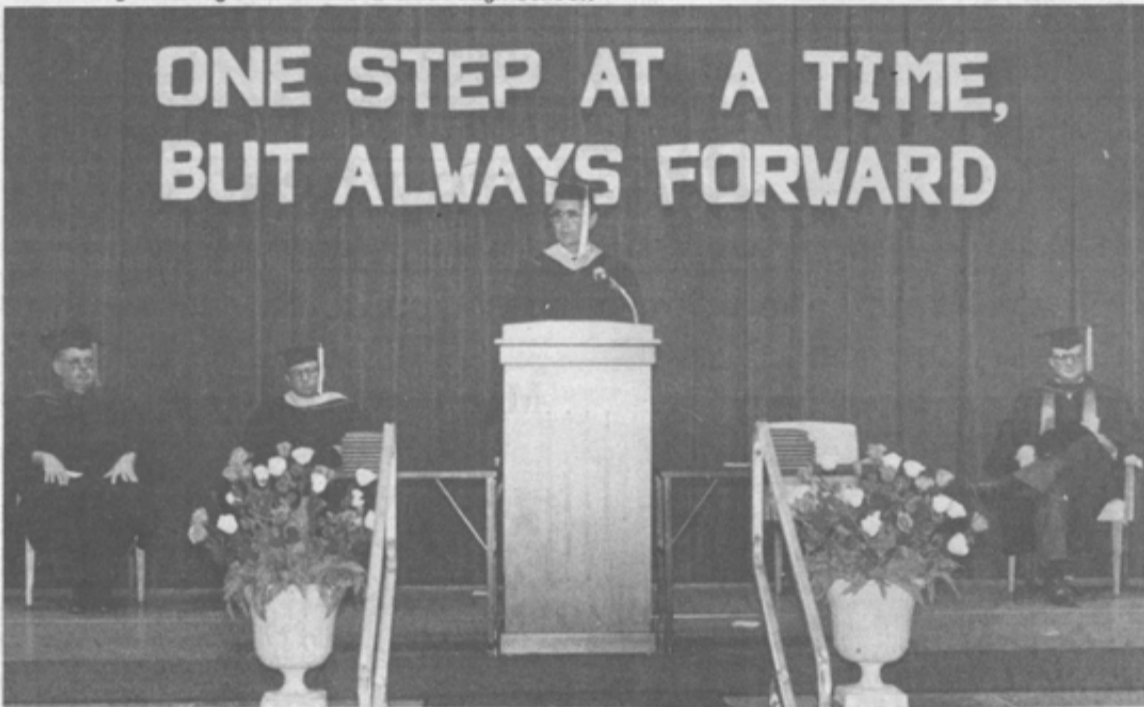

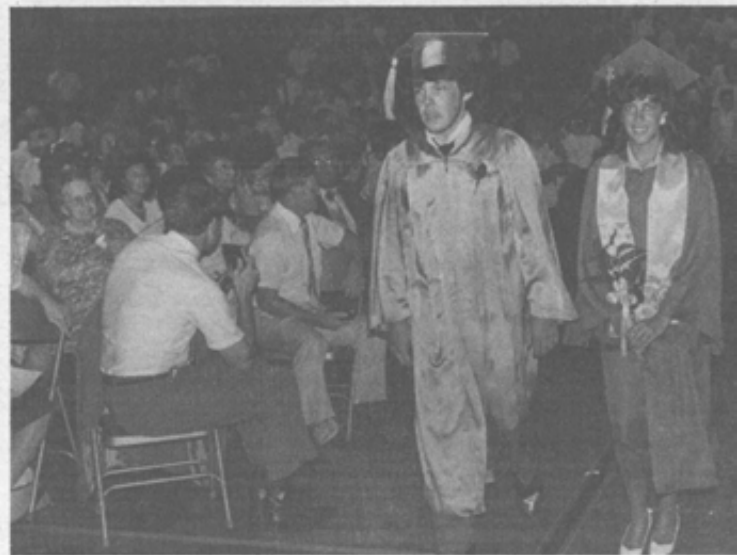

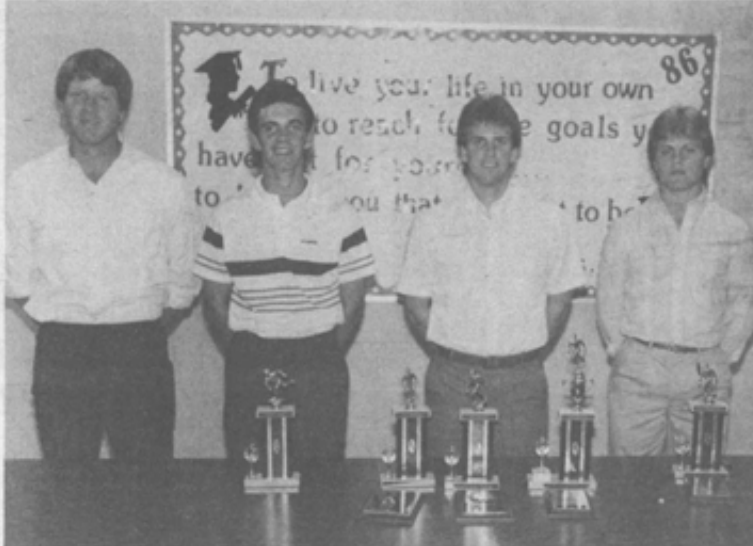

ORDINANCE NO. 71-4-2
AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING AND REGULATION OF BICYCLES IN MINSTER, OHIO, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF. THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE FROM AND AFTER PASSAGE, APPROVAL AND PUBLICATION AS PROVIDED BY LAW.

Be It Ordained by the Council of the Village of Minster, Ohio, that No person who resides within the corporate limits of the Village of Minster shall ride or propel a bicycle upon any of the streets, alleys, or public grounds in the Village of Minster unless said bicycle has been licensed as hereinafter provided.

The owner of any bicycle, who desires to ride or propel said bicycle upon any of the streets, alleys, or public grounds in the Village of Minster, shall first procure a license for said bicycle from the Chief of Police, to be issued for a three year license fee in the amount of \$5.00.

All bicycle licenses issued under the provisions of this ordinance shall expire on the first day of July of every third year beginning with 1971 regardless of the date of issue and in the event any licensed bicycle is sold, the licensee shall promptly notify the Chief of Police of the name of the new owner, but no new license shall be required for the owner until the expiration date of the present license.

REQUIRED EQUIPMENT - All bicycles used within the village limits shall display a reflector no smaller than 1-1/2 inches in diameter, or luminous tape no smaller than two inches in width and one inch in length, placed on the rear of the bicycle.

RIDING ON SIDEWALKS - Pedestrians on sidewalks or marked crosswalks shall have the right of way at all times over persons riding bicycles.

MISCELLANEOUS REGULATIONS -

A. Persons riding bicycles shall not hook into or be towed by or to any other vehicle.

B. Passengers on motorcycle and bicycles. (a) A person operating a bicycle or motorcycle shall not ride other than upon the permanent and regular seat attached thereto, nor carry any other person upon such bicycle or motorcycle other than upon a firmly attached and regular seat thereon nor shall any person ride upon a bicycle or motorcycle other than as above authorized.

(b) No bicycle or motorcycle shall be used to carry more persons at one time than the number for which it is designated and equipped (Ord. 22.2).

C. The driver of any bicycle shall not follow any emergency vehicle traveling in response to an alarm closer than five hundred feet or drive into or park a bicycle within the block where fire apparatus has stopped in answer to a firm alarm unless directed to do so by a police officer or fireman. (Modifies 24.10)

D. Bicycles must be ridden only in the direction of vehicular travel. Persons riding bicycles upon roadway, shall ride not more than two abreast.

E. All persons riding bicycles in the Village shall obey all vehicular traffic laws.

VIOLATIONS - It is a misdemeanor for any persons to do any act prohibited or fail to perform an act required in this ordinance and any parent or guardian who shall knowingly authorize or permit an child or ward to violate any of the provisions of this article shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

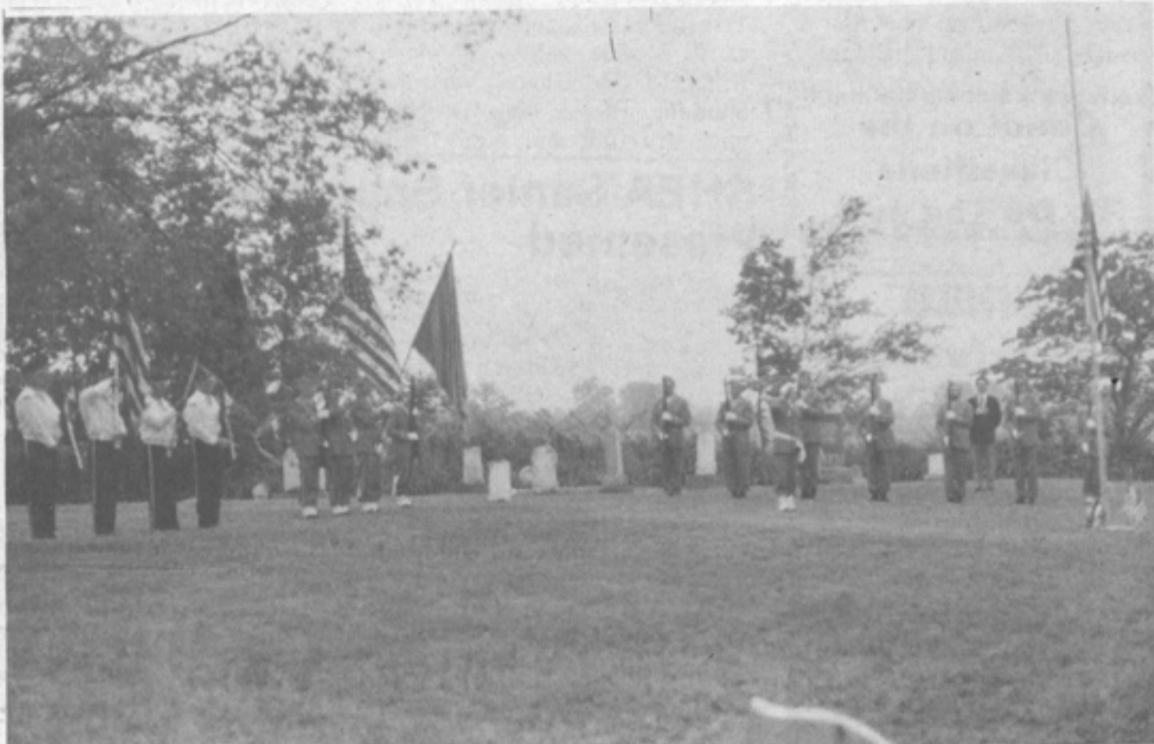
